The Miłosz Festival 2026

27 June–5 July 2026

‘Against Them’ – the theme of this year’s Miłosz Festival

“Under this sky, in the 20th century / life is hard and the truth is not easy” – these lines bring the poem “Against Them” to a close; its title serves as the theme of the 15th edition of the Miłosz Festival.

“After almost a hundred years, these words are still just as relevant,” says Szymon Kloska, the event’s curator. “This year, we are returning to the roots of the doyen of Polish poetry. ‘Against Them’ is a poem included in his debut collection, “A Poem of Frozen Time”, which was published when Miłosz was just 22 years old. A sense of historical significance, the ability to articulate socio-political tensions, and the capacity to offer incisive analyses of reality – Miłosz demonstrated these skills in a remarkable way at such a young age.”

“By choosing this motto, we are continuing the tradition of highlighting the social dimensions of poetry. This year’s event, like the two previous editions, seeks to answer the question of how poetry can become a language for describing the world, and in particular the difficult social reality shaped by the polarisation that has been growing in recent years,” adds Maria Świątkowska, the festival’s executive director.

It takes place in the Kazimierz district of Krakow and, for over three decades, has been an important venue where tradition, history and contemporary Jewish creativity come together.

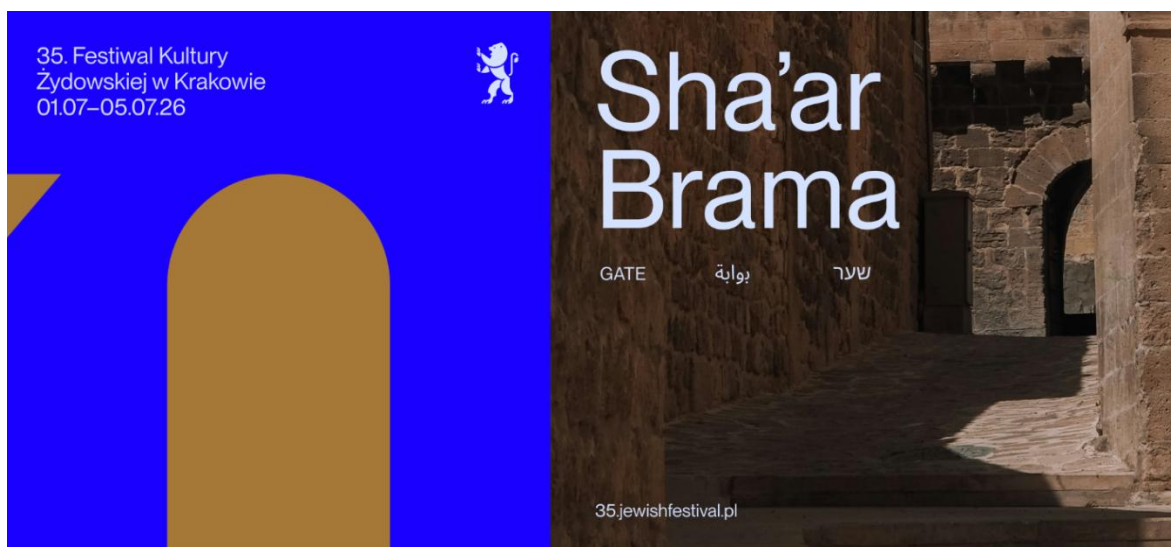
This year's 35th edition of the festival is being held under the theme 'Gate' (Hebrew: 'Sha'ar'), which symbolically refers to the idea of openness – both to culture and dialogue, and to the diverse experiences of Jewish identity. The festival is international in scope and attracts artists and audiences from many countries, presenting a rich and multifaceted picture of Jewish culture – from tradition to the present day.

The programme of the 35th festival features a wide range of artistic and educational events, such as concerts, workshops, exhibitions, talks, themed walks and film screenings. Together, these elements create an open space for dialogue and for exploring Jewish culture in its various forms and contexts.

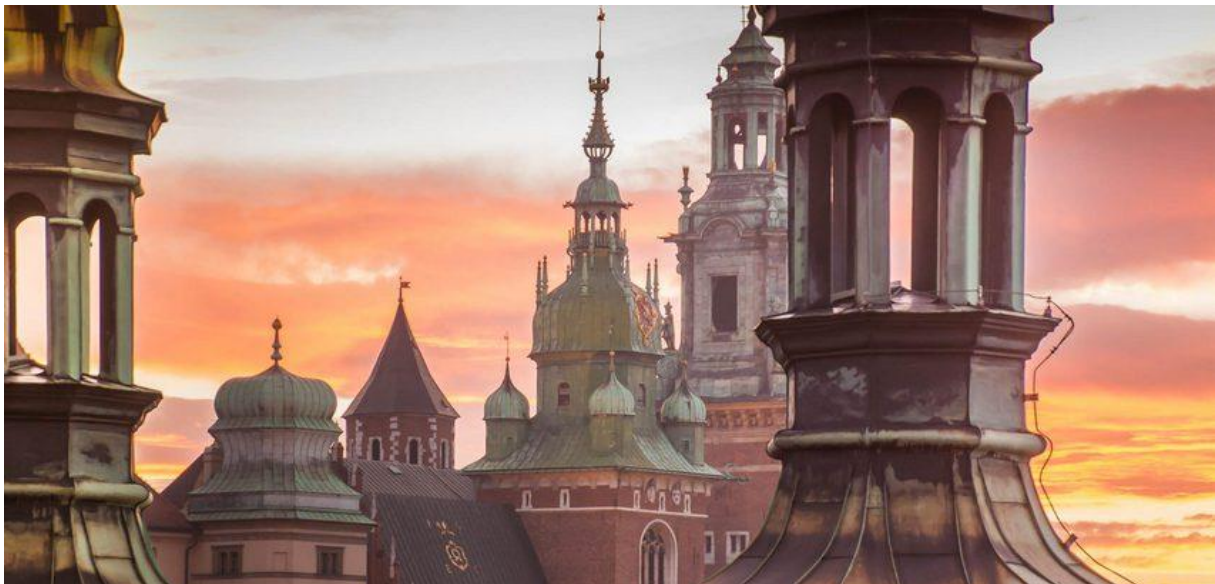

Climbing World Cup in Rynek Główny

3–5 July 2026

Rynek Główny in Krakow

From 3 to 5 July 2026, Rynek Główny will host the second Krakow edition of the Speed Climbing World Cup, which forms part of the World Climbing Series. This year's competition will feature three days of competition, the debut of mixed relays and a larger prize fund.

This year's event will be bigger than last year's competition. A four-lane track will be erected in Rynek Główny, enabling teams to race side by side. For the first time in the history of the sport, mixed relays will be held. The organisers have also ensured that the prize fund for the competitors has been increased.

The first edition, held in 2025, proved to be a huge success. Around 20,000 spectators watched the competition live in Rynek Główny, and the television broadcast was shown in over 40 countries. In total, as many as 63 million media mentions of the Krakow event were recorded. The arena, situated in the heart of one of Europe's most recognisable urban spaces, demonstrated that Krakow is capable of combining major sporting events with the unique backdrop of the Old Town.

The 39th edition of the ULICA International Street Theatre Festival will take place from 3 to 5 July and from 10 to 12 July 2026. This year's edition will be themed around 'La Strada', a reference to the aesthetics and traditions of the circus and its presence in contemporary street theatre.

For nearly four decades, the KTO Theatre has been inviting artists from all over the world to transform Krakow and other cities into an open, vibrant theatre scene. The ULICA Festival, organised by the KTO Theatre and its director Jerzy Zoń, is one of the most important and best-known street theatre events in Central and Eastern Europe.

Every year, the festival brings together nearly two hundred artists representing a variety of artistic traditions and forms, and attracts tens of thousands of visitors – both locals and tourists. The performances are staged primarily in public spaces across Krakow, but the festival regularly extends beyond the city's boundaries, reaching other towns and involving new communities in its activities.

The Thieving Magpie

16 and 18 July 2026, 7:30/ 5:00 p.m.

Gioachino Rossini's 'The Thieving Magpie' (*La gazza ladra*) is a 'semiseria' opera in two acts with a libretto by Giovanni Gherardini, based on the French play 'La pie voleuse'.

The story is set in a rural community, where a young maid named Ninetta is wrongly accused of stealing silver cutlery. Faced with prejudice, abuse of power and a dramatic trial, the girl finds herself in mortal danger. It is only at the very last moment that it comes to light that the real culprit behind the commotion is a magpie, which had been stealing shiny objects and hiding them in its hideout. By combining elements of comedy and drama, Rossini created a moving tale of injustice, courage and the triumph of truth.

The work, which had its world premiere at La Scala in Milan in 1817, is one of the composer's most fascinating operas and continues to delight audiences to this day with its famous overture and masterful music.

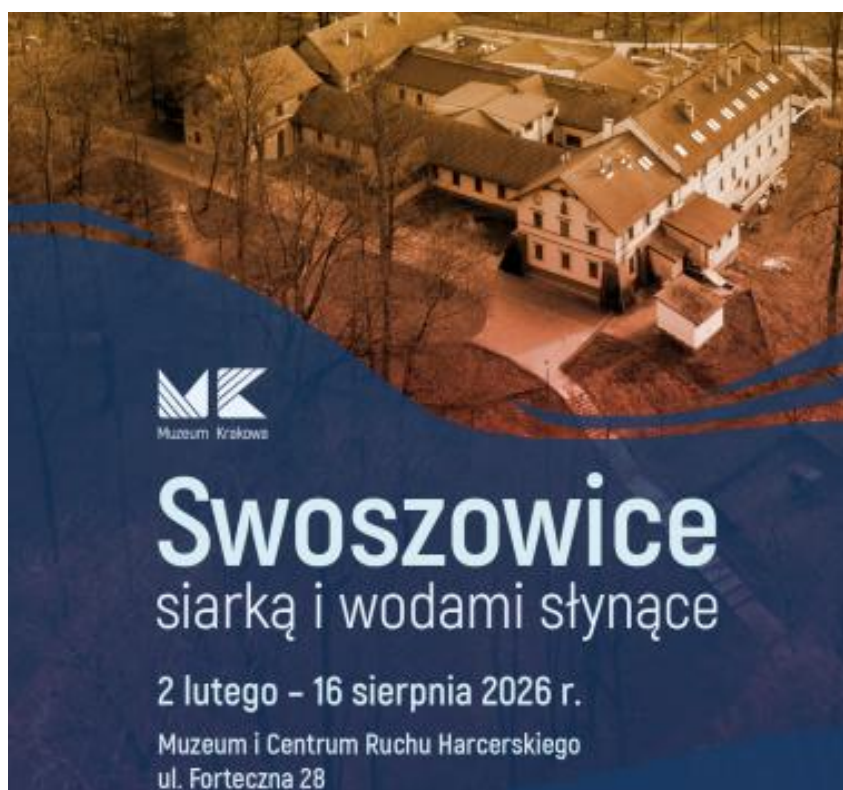

27th "Cracovia Danza" Court Dance Festival

18–26 July 2026

various locations

Wawel, Rynek Główny and Na Groblach Square are the most beautiful backdrops for this year's edition of the festival. Its theme is 'Time and Clocks in Dance and Ballet'. As the organisers emphasise, it draws attention to rhythm, repetition and precision of movement, as well as to time as a theme in ballet performances. The highlight of July's festival of historical dance is likely to be the premiere of 'Czary-zegary' (Spells and Clocks), a suite of Baroque dances inspired by the works of Jean-Baptiste Lully. This production by the Cracovia Danza Ballet was created in collaboration with the French company Compagnie HéliosKine, and the choreography is by Pierre-François Dollé. Among the international guests, we will also be seeing Sanscriti Alaknandra from India, amongst others. As is traditional, the festival programme includes a performance of Polish dances in Rynek Główny, concluding with a group polonaise. The court dance workshops, which will culminate in the Krakow Royal Ball, are aimed at a wide audience. There will also be workshops for children and young people – 'Krakow Dances beneath Wawel' – and masterclasses for professionals. The festival's artistic director and founder is Romana Agnel, and it is organised, as always, by Cracovia Danza Ballet, which she heads.

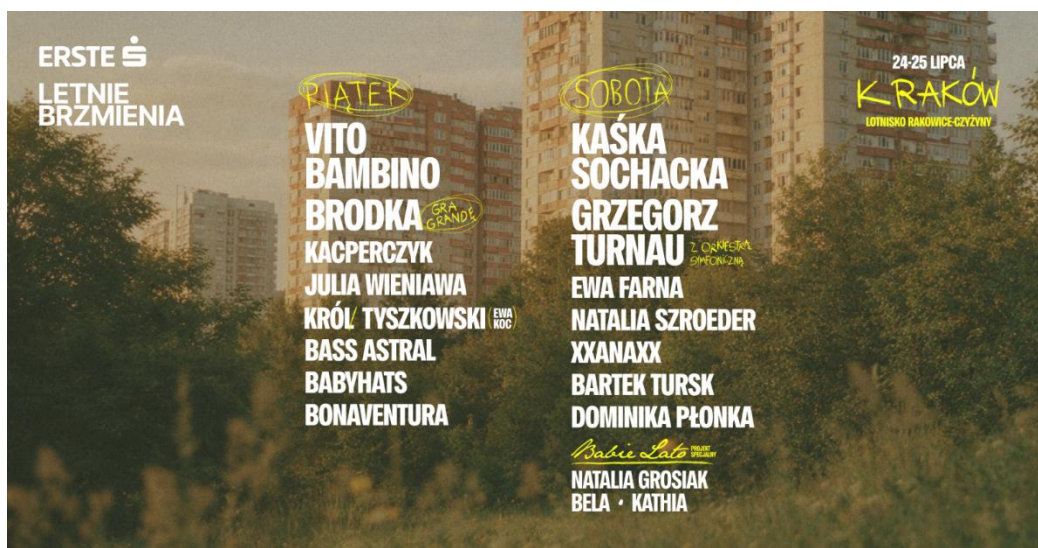

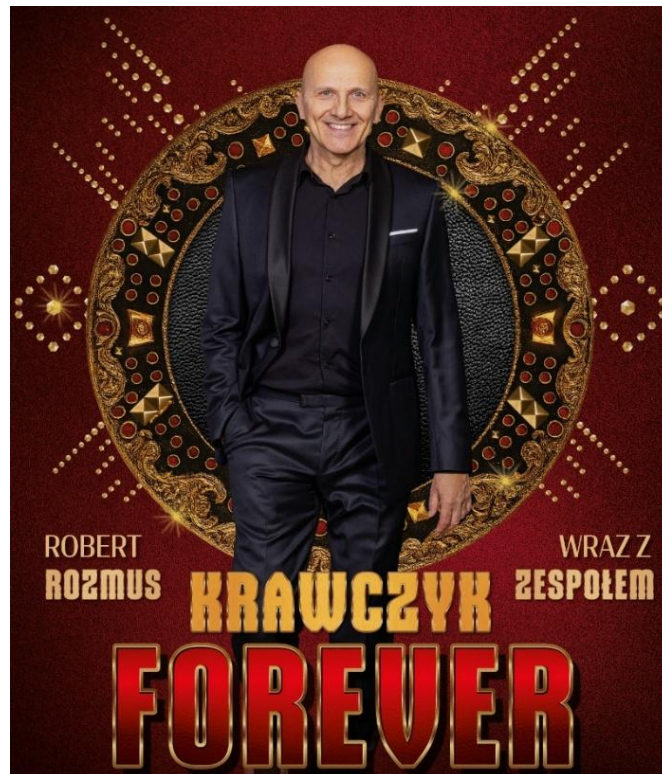
